PLEASE READ AND ABIDE BY ALL THE RULES

Class 1 MINI

A Lead Rein

B Assisted

C Unassisted Assistance may be given but ANY assistance (other than calling the dressage test) will incur a 50 point penalty

Dressage Test: Pony Club Walk and Trot Test 2013

No back poles in show jumping course. Shorted XC course, fences approx. 20 – 30cm

Please note division's may be combined for placings if insufficient entries in separate divisions.

Class 2 MINI ADULTS

Dressage Test: Intro B (2009)

No back poles in show jumping course. Shorted XC course, fences approx. 20 – 30cm

Assistance may be given but ANY Assistance (other than calling the dressage test) will incur a 50 point penalty

Class 3: MINI PLUS

Dressage Test: Intro B (2009)

Fences approx. 40cm

Assistance may be given but ANY Assistance (other than calling the dressage test) will incur a 50 point penalty

This class is a great stepping stone on from our mini classes, on the cross country phase you will start over the mini course and then progress into the hill field over some lovely encouraging 40cm jumps and then back to the mini course to finish.

Class 4: NOVICE

Assistance may be given but ANY Assistance (other than calling the dressage test) will incur a 50 point penalty.

We have introduced two divisions, both divisions will jump the same cross country course, however you can choose a walk, trot dressage test, or a walk, trot & canter dressage test.

Division 1 Dressage Test: Intro B (2009)

Division 2 Dressage Test: Prelim 14 (2006)

Fences approx. 50cm

Class 5: NOVICE PLUS

Assistance may be given but ANY Assistance (other than calling the dressage test) will incur a 50 point penalty.

Division 1 Junior: riders 17 years and under on 1st January 2018

Division 2 Senior: riders 18 years and over on 1st January 2018

Dressage test: Prelim 14 (2006)

Fences approx. 60cm

Class 6: INTERMEDIATE

Division 1 Junior: riders 17 years and under on 1st January 2018

Division 2 Senior: riders 18 years and over on 1st January 2018

Dressage test: BE90 Dressage Test 95 (2012)

No whips allowed for the Intermediate & Open class dressage.

Fences approx. 70cm

No Assistance allowed (other than calling the dressage test)

Class 7: OPEN

Division 1 Junior: riders 17 years and under on 1st January 2018

Division 2 Senior: riders 18 years and over on 1st January 2018

Dressage test: BE90 Dressage Test 95 (2012)

No whips allowed for the Intermediate & Open class dressage.

Fences approx. 80cm

No Assistance allowed (other than calling the dressage test)

Class 8: OPEN PLUS

Division 1 Junior: riders 17 years and under on 1st January 2018

Division 2 Senior: riders 18 years and over on 1st January 2018

Dressage test: BE90 Dressage Test 95 (2012)

No whips allowed for the Intermediate & Open class dressage.

Fences approx. 85cm, with a more technical cross country phase.

No Assistance allowed (other than calling the dressage test)

Assistance means "Forbidden assistance" as defined by the 2016 Pony Club Eventing Rule Book sections 29(h) and 31(m).

Ditches

Please note there are **no ditches** in any classes.

The Water

Mini & Mini Plus Classes – The water is completely optional. It will not incur any penalties, however only 3 attempts may be made, after which you will need to move onto the next fence.

50cm & 60cm Classes – The water can be missed out, however you will incur 20 penalties. If you attempt the water and have any problems you will incur those penalties, in addition to the 20 penalties for missing the water out.

70cm, 80cm & 80cm Plus Classes – The water is fully included as part of the course, and will incur penalties inline with all other fences.

Please note that after 3 attempts at the water you will be asked to use the alternative route and continue on the course, this is to allow competitors following clear access to the water jump.

ENTRIES: Entries online in advance via Equo Events. No telephone entries. Entries close Tuesday prior to the competition. Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Entries Secretary and subject to a late entry fee of an extra £5.

ENTRY FEES: Class 1 & 2 £35 Classes 3 - 8 £45

Plus £3 per competitor first aid contribution

All entrants must supply their own number bibs.

All hats must be of the current PC / RC standards and be correctly fitted, with tight chin straps fitted as per manufacturers guidelines.

TIMES: Will be available on our Facebook Page and Equo Events from the Friday before the competition.

COURSE WALKING: the ground will be open from 1pm on the Saturday before the competition (the day before).

PRIZES: Trophy for 1st Place competitors, rosettes 1st to 6th place in each section. Specials for all unplaced in Class 1 & 2. Rosette for highest placed dressage combination in each division. Classes may be divided into separate divisions depending on numbers. Classes may be combined for placings if insufficient entries.

RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. The event is run under Pony Club Eventing Rules 2018. Please read the rules, which can be downloaded from the Pony Club website, before entering, and abide by them at all times. The rules will have the following exceptions:

- a. If you have three refusals at one fence you may go on, at the Judge's/Steward's discretion.
- b. If you are eliminated in the Show Jumping you may go on to the Cross Country phase ONLY IF you have the permission of the Show Jumping Judge that you are safe to continue (whose decision is final).
- c. Classes 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5 - the Dressage test may be ridden in any normal riding bit (such as a snaffle, gag, or pelham type with a straight bar, single joint or french link). Classes 6 & 7 the Dressage test must be ridden in a snaffle type bit.
- d. Class 1 may wear grass reins.
- e. The cross country course is not timed in any of the classes.
- f. Some fences may be wide flagged to assist horse / pony and riders, the jump option required for each class will be clearly marked.

2. A horse/pony may only be entered in one class and ridden once, there are only exceptions to this;

- A horse / pony may compete in a second mini class with a second rider.
- A horse / pony and rider may enter one mini class and the mini plus class.

All horses/ponies must be 4 years old or over. No stallions.

3. Dressage tests may be called for all classes

4. BODY PROTECTORS are compulsory for cross-country and body protectors are advised for show jumping. Riders wearing body cages must leave a key with the secretary before going cross country.

5. A fastened hat must be worn at all times when mounted. Please ensure you are wearing a hat that conforms to the 2018 standards, with the chin strap tightly secured, as per manufacturers guidelines. If in doubt, please refer to the Pony club website. This will be checked before the dressage – take any untagged hats to the secretary beforehand. There will be a charge of £1 for hats to be tagged. A fastened hat must be worn at all times when mounted.

6. Any competitor who has a fall or sustains a serious injury anywhere at the competition site must see medical personnel on the day and be passed fit to ride before riding that horse in a further test or before riding any other horse. Any competitor having a fall injury needs to report to the Secretary to have the fall logged in the Accident log.

7. Objections may be lodged, in writing, to the Secretary with a £10 deposit within 10 minutes of the publication of the results for that class.

8. Excessive use of whip or spurs will result in disqualification, the judges decision is final.

9. All withdrawals must be made by the closing date.

10. If cancelled, £5.00 will be retained from the entry fee; the balance will be paid in June on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope.

11. All dogs must be kept on a short lead, and are not allowed on the cross country course when it is open.

12. Please do not muck out lorries/trailers in the car park and take all litter and hay home.

13. The Judges decision is final.

14. Health, safety and welfare: The organisers have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at this event. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents. They must obey the instructions of the organisers and all officials and stewards.

15. Legal liability: Save for the death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers, or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of this event or The Pony Club/ The Riding Club nor any agent, employee or representative of these bodies, nor the landlord or his tenant, accepts any liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land, cars, their contents and accessories, or any other personal property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever. Entries are only accepted on this basis.
